LIFE AS AN INTERNATIONAL CAT CELEBRITY



My name is Smokey - I am one of Mr Tibbs' furiends on Twitter and also a member of the #wlf. I am about 12 years old and an 'International cat celebrity' and holder of the Guinness World Record for purring. I was recorded in April 2011, purring at a level of 67.7db 1 metre away. This is 14 times louder than an average cat.

I had an unsettling start to my life before I found my forever home in Northamptonshire with Ruth's family. I was so happy that I could not stop singing. My purring became so loud that it drowned out the television and phone calls. Ruth suggested that I should sing on local radio to help promote a spaying and neutering campaign for our local branch of 'Cats Protection.'

On the 9th February 2011 my purring was broadcast on the air waves and within weeks I had been pictured in Newspapers all around the world with headlines of 'Purrs like a Boeing 747.' We agreed to attempt the Guinness World Records for purring and we were successful in gaining the title of 'loudest purring domestic cat'.






I soon attracted film crews from America as well as England. I even gave a live satellite interview. I have been filmed for the American 'Love Must Love Cats' TV show and for an ITV documentary about Guinness World Records. I make regular appearances to help promote animal charities too. Last October, billed as the 'lawnmower cat', I was a star attraction at the National 'Love Pets' show. My staff also arrange visits to schools for me, where we talk about Guinness World Records.

As all international celebrities do, I have written my autobiography and embarked on a tour of bookshops to meet my fans and sign pawtographs. Larry the Downing Street cat provided a celebrity review for my book: "So I congratulate Smokey, the loudest cat in the world, on her wonderful book. Smokey you really are the cat that got the cream!" The RSPCA noted that "Ruth, her owner, clearly loves not only Smokey, but also all cats and wanted this book to assist readers to help other cats."
