Garden View

This month - Prepare for Spring

September is the time to plan your spring bulb purchases. The best selections always sell out quickly and it's frustrating when the prettiest crocuses and tulips are not available.



If you're planting bulbs for the first time, or in a new area of the garden it helps to have a colour scheme in mind. In a boydominated house (three sons and a husband) I like to give some areas of my garden a more girly theme. Tulips are great for this purpose (and are some of my favourite flowers). Try 'La Belle Epoque', which is a frothy peony-flowered tulip with pale coffee petals flushed with pink. I would contrast the texture of its showier blooms with another more traditional tulip, Pink Diamond' or 'Apricot Beauty'. If you'd prefer less 'pretty' and more drama try the almost-black 'Paul Scherer', which should flower in late April or early May and makes a good foil to the aforementioned Apricot Beauty, which flowers at the same time.

I garden on quite dry limey soil, and I've mentioned before my love affair with Bath Chatto's planting schemes. Sadly, she died in 2018 but her gardens and trust continue and are well worth a visit. This year on their recommendation I'm trying Ornithogalum pyrenaicum, known poetically as the spiked star of Bethlehem, and more prosaically as Bath asparagus.. It has subtle, green flowers and grows to 50-60cm tall. It pairs well leaved plants like Stachys, which grows like a weed in my garden, and best of all, once established you can harvest it like asparagus.

with silver-

I like to plant up a few pots this month, for some late

autumn and winter colour. I favour Rusttoned heucheras, paired with miniature grasses such as Carex buchananii; Oxblood-coloured ajuga, silver-leaved thymes and small-leaved trailing ivies make great combinations too.

I have sempervivums shoved in crevices all over my garden. They are incredibly hardy and will survive all manner of frost and poor weather. We have a lovely sheltered sunny patio with a small table and chairs which is lovely to sit out on even in the winter. A few years ago, I started planting up shallow terracotta trays and a couple of old tin bowls with differing varieties of house leek. I mix one -part horticultural grit to one part peat-free multipurpose compost for the planting mix, and make sure any container has lots of drainage. Handy tip - top dress with grit or stones if you don't want the birds to start digging around scattering your planting mix and unearthing your plants! I learned the hard way! These little flat planting bowls make a lovely table display and also make wonderful birthday and...erm...Christmas gifts.

September 22nd marks the Autumn Equinox. It's the end of summer and the start of a new

season. But what is a season? We all instinctively know the difference between summer and winter but who decides when they start and end? Are there official dates? Well actually yes.

A season is defined as a period of the

year distinguished by special climate conditions. The four seasons: spring, summer, autumn, and winter each have their own light, temperature, and weather patterns that repeat yearly.

In the UK the winter solstice generally begins on December 21 or 22. This is the day of the year with the shortest period of daylight. Summer begins on June 20 or 21, the summer solstice, the day which has the most daylight of any day in the year. Spring and autumn, begin on days that have equal amounts of daylight and darkness. The vernal, or spring, equinox falls on March 20 or 21, which brings us back to autumn which starts at the end of the month. The seasons of the Northern Hemisphere are the opposite of those in the Southern Hemisphere, which is why in Australia, summer begins in December, winter begins in June and Christmas lunch is served on the beach!

Our seasons occur because Earth is tilted on its axis relative to the orbital plane, the invisible, flat disc where most objects in the solar system orbit the sun. Earth revolves on its axis, which is an invisible line that runs through its centre, from pole to pole.

In June, when our Northern Hemisphere is tilted toward the sun, the sun's rays hit it for more of the day than in winter, which



means we receive more hours of daylight. In December, when the Northern

> Hemisphere is tilted away from the sun, there are fewer hours of daylight.

But our four-season year is not experienced all over the globe. Four seasons only occur in the mid-latitudes, which are places that are not too near the poles or Equator. The

further north (or south) you go within these mid-latitudes, the bigger the differences in the seasons. For example, Helsinki in Finland sees a full 18.5 hours of daylight in the middle of June whereas in mid-December it barely gets 6 hours. Athens in Greece however in the far south of Europe, has a smaller variation, with 14.5 hours of daylight in June and 9.5 hours in December.

Places near the Equator experience little seasonal variation and receive the same amount of daylight and darkness throughout the whole year. These places remain warm year-round and typically have just two seasons, a rainy season, and a dry one.

Polar regions do experience seasonal variation, although they are obviously colder than most other places on the planet. Near the poles, the amount of daylight changes dramatically between summer and winter. In Barrow, Alaska, the northernmost city in the U.S., it stays light all day long between mid-May and early August, while in winter the city is in total darkness.

I love the fact we have four seasons in the UK but just a small change in global temperature could cause the seasons to shift or become more extreme. We can't take our wonderful seasons for granted.



Most people think of 'Vitamin D' as the 'sunshine vitamin' – the one essential for bone health by preventing Rickets and associated conditions.

Whilst the idea is true to some extent, it is an incomplete view when up to date knowledge is taken into account. Firstly, 'Vitamin D' is really a pro-hormone. All the other hormones are critical for both fertility and mental health and pro-hormone D actually helps regulate them all, including cortisol and thyroid hormones. The more one learns about its roles, the more one can see it is as essential to our health as sunlight is to plant health. Indeed, plant chlorophylls in our diet work with pro hormone-D to regulate our immune response systems. With Vitamin K2, Magnesium, Zinc and Glutathione, it supports our lymphocytes to ensure our health is in balance.

When the current recommendations were set for what most call 'Vitamin D', they were based purely on ensuring good bone health and didn't address the need for its role in immune health arguably a more important consideration when one looks at the possibility of pro-hormone D making most non-hospital based antibiotics unnecessary! So, a rate was set of 400iu of Vitamin D a day for bone health. Some experts today believe we need 5-10,000iu a day for immune health so 20 times as much. In this country 80% of people are 'Vitamin D' deficient and this can lead to more cancers, more heart

disease, strokes, inflammatory diseases of all descriptions and allergies, all of which have increased in the last 80 years. Could this increase reflect the introduction and expansion in the prevalence of chemicals in our food, water and environment? Our immune systems are further challenged as our natural sources of pro-hormone D are compromised because the animals that supply our meat are now reared indoors away from the health giving, pro-hormone D making sunshine. Even when we or the animals CAN get outdoors, we are challenged by all the pollution particulates and the increased water vapour which reflect the UVB (Ultra-Violet B Light) away. So even with the superficially innocuous act of increasing the amount of vapour / clouds in the atmosphere through global heating, we do our immune systems incalculable damage. When the Department of Health agreed upon the importance of 'Vitamin D', they recommended 400iu - a dose that would have NO impact on supporting immune function, only supporting bone health and fractures did come down as a result.

Perhaps one day we will all take pro-hormone D at 4000iu daily minimum and we will see a decrease in ALL infections including Covid?!

Banana Upside Down Cake

For lovers of caramel everywhere



Line a 20 x 20cm square baking tin or a 23cm round tin with baking parchment. It's best not to use a loose-bottomed tin but if you do fold the parchment so it goes up the sides of the tin too. Otherwise, the caramel will leak out into the oven!

To make the topping, place the sugar, butter, and golden syrup into a small heavy-bottomed saucepan. Heat until

Ingredients

For Banana Topping 120 g brown sugar 60 g butter 1.5 tbsp golden syrup 3 bananas sliced For the Cake 2 ripe bananas 2 tbsp yoghurt 90 g butter at room temperature 180 g caster sugar 1 tsp vanilla extract 2 eggs 180 g self-raising flour

1/2 tsp cinnamon

1/4 tsp nutmeg

Method

Preheat the oven to 180C.

all the sugar and butter have melted. Stir gently and pour into the tin, tilting the tin backwards and forwards so the layer of caramel completely covers the bottom.

Slice the bananas into pieces about 2cm thick. Place them in the caramel.

For the cake, mash the bananas with a fork then mix into the yogurt. Set aside.

Place the butter and sugar into a large mixing bowl. Whisk till pale and fluffy.

Add the vanilla extract and eggs, one at a time, whisking after each one.

Sift the flour and spices together and gradually fold into the mixing bowl. Then fold in the banana and yoghurt mixture.

Spoon the batter into the cake tin on top of the caramel and bananas.

Bake at 180C for about 45 minutes. Test with a skewer to see if it's cooked. If necessary bake for a little longer.

When ready, remove the cake from the oven and let it stand for a couple of minutes. Then place a plate on top of the tin and turn it over to remove the cake.





Hi everyone.

Well it has been a long time since my last column in March 2020 and so much has happened since then. It has been a very worrying and miserable time for most and also incredibly sad. We hope and pray that the vaccines will prove fully effective and that the pandemic will be brought under control soon.

Here at the rescue, we have said tearful goodbyes to several of our long-term residents who have gone over 'The Rainbow

Bridge'. It is always such a wrench to lose a beloved family member and we do miss them terribly. We also said hello to some new residents who arrived due to being made homeless when their owners had to move. They have fitted in beautifully and are fully integrated with our gang. We have also taken in a poor kitty who was in a dreadful state when he arrived and needed an emergency veterinary operation on his mouth to remove several growths that made it almost impossible for him to eat and he drooled terribly. He had a most awful skin condition too, with huge bald areas and bleeding sores. As he is a black cat, we called him Obsidian (Sid for short) and gave him all the love and attention we possibly could whilst we nursed him back to health. Today he is a very happy, affectionate little boy, is able to eat properly and all his beautifully soft fur has grown back. Sid will stay with us forever now as one of our much loved sanctuary cats so we can keep an eye on him and make sure there is no recurrence of any problems.

Some more good news: Earlier this year we were contacted by one of our lovely adopters who had been feeding a feral cat for several years in his garden but was sure this poor cat would not be able to survive another winter outside on his own. There are a few rescues who have facilities for ferals, where they can live free within a secure environment and be taken care of, so we reached out and found him a wonderful place with a friend of ours 'down South'. First of all however, we needed to trap him and find somewhere for him to go whilst we arranged transport to get him there. One of our wonderful fosterers stepped up and so we were able to put things in motion. He was trapped, checked for a chip (none) and transported to our fosterer straight away. And then we all had a very big surprise! He wasn't at all feral, just very, very scared and timid and a gentle, nice natured little boy. Within days he was offered a home and is settling there very well, much loved and adored as is only right and proper. We do so love a happy ending.





your life out for you, with their collections of 1001 Places to

Go/Films to See/Things to do Before You Die/Turn 40/Lose the Will to Live Such collections vary in guality too - some are weighty coffee table tomes, beautifully illustrated, which reward random opening and selection, whereas others have a distinct sense of being 'thrown together' for a key shopping moment in the crowded calendar.

Well, if you have a book buff among your acquaintances, here is a collection with a difference. Sutherland and Fender have used the days of the year as their format. and each day contains a mini essay concerning a literary event from history. Some are uproariously funny anecdotes. some are well-known tales of foolishness or excessiveness which stand up well to a second/third/tenth telling, and some are serious musings on life and literature - in other words Love. Sex. Death and Words.

So, in a typical month, you might go from Peter Pan to TS Eliot, or from Francis Bacon to Harry Potter. The day-by-day format suggests that the authors intended this to be a book 'dipped in to' on any given day. However, the quality and variety is such that it can be read all at once should you so wish - I did and passed an enormously entertaining train journey rattling straight through from January to June.


The Queen's Knickers - Nicholas Allan

Since it was published back in the year 2000 The Queen's Knickers has become a modern classic. Go on, take a peek!








